## Voters can use 1 of 7 forms of photo ID:

With exception of citizenship certificate, IDs may be expired up to four years.

- Driver license
- Texas Election Identification Certificate (EIC)
- Texas Personal Identification Card issued by DPS
- Texas license to carry a handgun issued by DPS
- US military identification card with your picture
- US citizenship certificate with your picture
- US passport

## Things To Know:

- Election officials can't question a voter about the use of an ID type.
- Poll watchers can't question a voter about voter ID issues.
- The ID address doesn't have to match the voter registration address. There is currently no address matching requirement.

## Don't Have An ID Listed On The Left? Here Are Other Acceptable Documents You Can Present:

- Valid voter registration certificate (card)
- Certified birth certificate
- Current utility bill
- Bank statement
- Government check
- Paycheck
- Any other government document with the individual's name and address

With A Document From The Above List  
You'll Be Asked To Sign A Reasonable  
Impediment Declaration. Talk To An  
Election Worker To Receive One.

## You Have The Right To:

- A ballot with written instructions on how to cast a ballot.
- Ask the polling place official for instructions on how to cast a ballot (no suggestions on how to vote).
- Receive up to two more ballots if you make a mistake on yours.
- If you can't write, see the ballot, or understand the language it's written in, you are able to ask for help in casting your ballot.
- Vote in secret and free from intimidation.
- Bring an interpreter to assist you as you qualify to vote if you do not understand the English language.
- Vote once at any early voting location during the early voting period.
- Report any voting rights abuse you see or experience.
